Your old laptop can be a child's first computer.

Reboot Nepal collects used laptops and devices from anywhere in the United States, tests and erases them at our warehouse, and delivers them to children in Nepal through trusted local non-profits. Shipping is free: we send you a prepaid label.

HOW IT WORKS

Six steps from your door to a classroom

1

Request a prepaid label

Tell us what you are sending. We email you a free shipping label.

YOUR HOME

2

Pack it and drop it off

Box the device with its charger, attach the label, hand it to the carrier.

IN TRANSIT

3

We receive, log and test it

Every device is scanned in, powered up and graded at our US warehouse.

US WAREHOUSE

4

We wipe it and prepare it

Storage fully erased, a fresh operating system installed, charger paired.

5

It ships to Nepal in a batch

Devices travel together with a manifest, tracked all the way.

IN TRANSIT

6

A partner places it with a child

Local non-profits hand devices to children and schools, and confirm it online.

WHAT WE ACCEPT

YES, PLEASE

-  Laptops
Windows, Mac or Linux, about ten years old or newer
-  Tablets and iPads
Working screen, Activation Lock turned off
-  Chromebooks
Any model that can still be updated or re-imaged
-  Chargers and accessories
Especially the charger for the device you send

NOT RIGHT NOW

-  Desktop towers and monitors
 -  Printers, scanners and TVs
 -  Loose or swollen batteries
- Broken or non-working devices: ask us first, they are often useful for parts.

NEPAL FLOODS · AUGUST 2026

Schools along the Trishuli lost everything. Your laptop can help them start again.

On 26 August 2026 part of a glacier on Langtang Lirung collapsed, sending a wall of water and debris down the Lende Khola and Trishuli rivers through Rasuwa, Nuwakot and Dhading. More than 1,300 people died and thousands are still missing. Homes, bridges and classrooms went with the river.

Reboot Nepal is prioritising schools in the flood-affected districts for upcoming batches, working through local partners and education authorities.

At Shree Bagheswori Secondary School in Galchhi, Dhading, students were saved by a lunch break and by teachers who hurried them out as the water rose. They came back to classrooms coated in mud, benches, walls and notebooks alike.

What we are doing about it

- ✓ Upcoming batches prioritise schools in Rasuwa, Nuwakot and Dhading.
- ✓ Devices go through partners and local education authorities to schools that are ready to use them, never into the middle of rescue operations.
- ✓ Every placement is recorded on our platform, so you can see which flood-affected school received your device.

Every device is tracked. You can check.

A record is created the moment a label is issued and follows the device through nine statuses to a partner's confirmation that it reached a child.

Donors see every step for the devices they sent.

Partners in Nepal confirm receipt and record placements.

Anyone can see totals, batches and partner organisations.

Children are never named or pictured. Devices are given, never sold.

What a laptop does for a flood-hit school

- ✓ Temporary learning centres can run lessons from a laptop when the textbooks are gone.
- ✓ Teachers can reach digital textbooks and the national curriculum while buildings are rebuilt.
- ✓ Students preparing for exams can keep pace instead of losing a school year.
- ✓ A laptop and its charger are light enough to reach schools that roads no longer do.

Ten devices or a thousand: run a drive

Companies refreshing hardware, schools retiring Chromebooks, temples, churches and community groups collecting over a few weeks fill a batch faster than anything else.

We send a stack of labels or arrange a pickup for ten or more devices.

We provide posters, a one-page guide and a full list of devices received.

You get an acknowledgement letter and a live view of where every device went.
